

Job Description: High School Math Teacher

Responsibilities:

Instruction and Curriculum Development:

- Deliver engaging, biblically integrated instruction that aligns with curriculum standards and the school's educational philosophy.
- Utilize a variety of instructional strategies to meet the diverse needs of students.
- Maintain subject area curriculum guides, documenting changes, improvements, and effective teaching strategies.
- Guide students in developing organized, effective learning habits, including maintaining academic notebooks.
- Assess and provide timely feedback on student assignments, projects, and assessments.
- Maintain accurate and up-to-date records in the school's Learning Management System (FACTS).

Student Engagement and Spiritual Formation:

- Lead students to practice Christian self-government, integrity, and servant leadership.
- Foster meaningful relationships with students that promote academic motivation and character development.
- Integrate biblical principles into daily instruction and discussions.

• Encourage student inquiry, critical thinking, and application of knowledge through a biblical worldview.

Communication and Collaboration:

- Maintain clear and timely communication with students, parents, and faculty.
- Conduct parent conferences as needed to discuss student progress and provide academic guidance.
